#### Principal's Message

Warm greetings from Union Christian College, Aluva.

'The Union Christian College, Alwaye, is established and maintained in the spirit of Jesus Christ by a Christian Association of members representing the cooperating churches and the Inter Church Fellowship to impart the finest values in life to young men and women regardless of caste, creed or community through wholesome education in various disciplines', states the Preamble to the Constitution of Union Christian College. As we countdown to the centennial of the college in 2021, it is imperative to

take stock of where we stand and envision the direction in which we must travel. At present, our college has 15 undergraduate programmes, 15 post graduate programmes and 9 research centres. The departments are staffed with meritorious faculty members, 47 of whom are PhD holders. We cater to 2753 students; 25 % belong to backward communities and 75% avail various types of fee concessions and scholarships. In the past three years, there has been an increase in the number of women students from 58 % to 73.6 % in the aided stream. Many of them are first generation learners. In addition, U C College is one among the few selected institutions hosting students from Lakshadweep. It is heartening to note that the passage of time has kept alive the vision of education reflected in the preamble. It is at this juncture that we have been recognised as the most eligible among colleges that have applied for RUSA infrastructure funding.

In its illustrious history, the UC community has responded proactively to all manner of challenges. As in 1924 and 1961, the college upheld our tradition of being a flood relief camp in August 2018 also. It opened its portals to around 13000 people without any financial aid from the government. The NCC was the backbone of our disaster management team along with the NSS, Sports and the Pain & Palliative Care unit. The relief activities could not have materialised without the support of the District Collector, the local government, NGOs and well-wishers. The Parent Teacher Association, faculty, non-teaching staff, former students and UCCAANA joined hands with the management to financially support flood affected staff and 82 severely affected students. I strongly believe that it is on the foundation of the whole person education imparted to UCCians that they have been able to prove their mettle in times of crises.

U C College has much more to achieve in the coming years. Infrastructure, class rooms, the library and men's hostel facilities need to be upgraded; a central instrumentation centre and an international house are yet to materialise; renovation is also a major challenge. With a common vision shared by students, faculty - former and present, staff-non teaching and supporting, alumni and friends, I am sure that we will be able to make it.

I thank our international partners - the United Board, Scranton Women's Centre, South Korea, International Christian University, Japan, Hope College, USA, North American and Kuwait alumni associations and all well-wishers for their inspiring support.

Today, the greatest asset of Union Christian College is our young, vibrant faculty and non teaching staff, who have a calling to mentor students in their charge. I have complete confidence in the integrity, commitment and spiritual and ethical leadership provided by our youngsters. With adequate support, training and enhanced professional competencies they can scale greater heights. May God help us in fulfilling the dreams of our founders.

#### A Hill of Hope

In August this year, when Kerala witnessed the heaviest rainfall of the century, Union Christian College became a haven of hope for people who had lost their homes and livelihoods in the torrential waters, making it one of the

largest relief camps functioning in the state. At its maximum capacity, the college camp accommodated around 13,000 people, whereas the district administration had expected

250-600. The unprecedented increase in the downpour, coupled with the simultaneous release of water from various dams into the Perivar River, saw an exponential increase in the number of people seeking food and

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shelter. Though resources were limited and volunteers few, a spirit of camaraderie and goodwill overcame all differences to ensure the smooth conduct of the camp.

Thara K Simon and Lt. Dr. G. Geethika, a team of dedicated teachers, non-teaching staff and 30 odd volunteers worked relentlessly to provide food and

#### **ECONOMICS**

Prof. Vamsi Vakulabharanam, from the University of Massachussetts delivered two lectures on 'Growth and Inequality in India after 1980s : A Class Perspective' and 'Re-reading Das Kapital'.

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#### **CPSD** Lights the Way

The Centre for Peace Studies and Dialogue, the first of its kind in Kerala, is a result of the collective experience of faculty and students associated with service learning programmes. With 25 student volunteers, the centre conducts lectures and workshops on peace in conflict situations, interfaith dialogue and interreligious understanding. The centre offers certificate programmes in fundamentals of peacebuilding and interreligious



dialogue and understanding. Members attended the National Peace Convention at Kochi which resonated the idea that lighting a lamp is better than cursing the darkness. Fourteen volunteers attended a workshop on Gandhian Leadership at Pala and a panel discussion sponsored by UCCAANA on 'Ragging-free Campuses: Striving Towards Peace' sponsored by UCCAANA and jointly organized with the Dept. of Psychology.

#### HISTORY

A lecture titled Madhyakalathile Chari-

A national seminar on *Samakalika Malayala Novel Vayanaum Vicharavum* was organized by the Malayalam





The One Touch Pain and Palliative Care Unit, as part of extending a healing touch, organized a gathering of 75 paraplegic patients, ORMA 2K18, on the campus in March.Mr. Arun Jose, of Insight Soft Skill and Motivational Training Centre conducted an orientation programme for the patients while students of the college provided cultural entertainment. The students also escorted the paraplegia patients to Kuzhuppilly beach for a day out, in April.

A visit to the Oncology and Isolation wards of the



General Hospital, Ernakulam brought the unit members closer to the sufferings of the terminally ill. A close association with Dr. Mohan, Head of 'Arike', (pain and palliative unit) also evolved out of the visit. The extension activities of the unit included material collection and fund-raising. 500 mentally challenged patients of Bethlehem 'Abhaya Bhavan', Kodanadu benefitted from the dress materials distributed by the students. 
