FLASHBACK: AN INTERVIEW WITH DR. V.I.MATHAN



Dr. V.I.Mathan is the son of our founding father V.M.Ittyerah. Vadakenadavil Dr. Ittyerah Mathan earned his MBBS and obtained MD in general medicine and a Ph.D. in Epidemiology from Madras University through the Christian Medical College, Vellore. He was trained in Gastroenterology at the Boston University with Professor Bob Donaldson and established the Department of Gastrointestinal Sciences at the Christian Medical College, Vellore on his return was also the in 1972. He Medical Superintendent (1989-94) and Director (1994-97) with significant administrative contributions.

Dr. V.I. Mathan was the head of the infectious disease department in an honorary capacity at ICMR. Until the pandemic broke out, he occupied that position. He is the recipient of various awards and honors.

Q. Can you please elaborate on the relationship between Prof. V.M.Ittyerah, Prof. K.C.Chacko, Prof C.P.Matthew, and Prof. A.M.Varki? How did they complement and sustain each other in their pursuit of a common dream of founding a college?

The vision to have a Christian Residential College in the then Travancore was the driving force that United Profs K.C.Chacko, A.M.Varki, C.P,Matthew, and V.M.Ittyerah. They were not Professors when they got this vision but young Lecturers who were working at the Madras Christian College. Their commitment to Christ and to develop the College as their witness to him was how they sustained in this difficult pursuit.

Q. We have heard that simplicity was a way of life on the campus then. How did your father, Prof Ittyerah practice it in his personal and professional life?

My father was always dressed very simply in a white Juba and Dhotie. He led a very simple life leaving for College by 8 in the morning and coming back in the evening only after the games period was over. All the years he was in Alwaye he took the Scripture Class for the Junior Intermediate (First Year). For this and for each of his lectures he would prepare seriously even in his final year and make lecture notes fresh. I cannot remember him going for a movie and he would come for the Dramatic presentations in College only to ensure discipline. He was very regular in his morning and evening devotions and would spend about an hour in the early morning with reading the Bible and prayer every day.

Q. Can you please share some of your memories of days spent on this campus?

I had a wonderful childhood. I was good at studies and also a very good Basketball player. Our house was next to the Basketball Court and when I was in the XII th, I would play Basketball with the college students. As I was very tall (6.1") I fit in immediately. When I joined the College, I became an official member of the team as they already knew what I could do.

My wife, Minnie Mariam Thomas, now Minnie Mathan, was my classmate in the College. I decided at first glance that she would be my wife, but did not speak to her for two years! In those days the girls would gather outside the Ladies Waiting Room next to the Physics Laboratory and teachers would remain in the class until all the women had left, so there were no opportunities to start a conversation. We trained together at Vellore after an all –India competitive selection, graduated and got married. She is a distinguished pathologist and an internationally acknowledged electron microscopist in Gastroenterology.

Q. We would appreciate you sharing a few memories of residential life and student -teacher relationships on the campus.

The relationship between the students and teachers was very close. My parents would invite groups of students for after dinner cake and coffee parties from the Holland Hostel in such a way that all the students would have come at least once a year to our house. They were particularly caring for any student who was sick. My Father would visit all students who reported sick and make sure that they had medical attention and regular food. Parents were always welcomed when they came to visit their wards and made to feel at home.

Q. What was the dress-code for students and teachers during those days? Are there any specific individuals who stand out in your memory in terms of their attire?

There was no formal dress code. Most boys wore Dhotie and Shirt. It was only towards the end of the senior intermediate class (1954–55) that wearing Trousers became more common.

Q.What were the popular pastime of students ? Did they have any extra -curricular activites or clubs that they could join?

Classes were from 8.30 to 4.30 with an hour off for lunch. Games were compulsory. The majority of the students were day scholars by1953 and usually did not take part in the games as many of them had to travel long distances.

Q. Was your choice of profession influenced by the values and experiences of your parents?

Yes, very much so. In 1947, when I was ten years old, my mother, who taught at the Mahilalayam School had to go to Vellore for a hysterectomy. I was in the Preparatory class or the Fifth form and was left under the charge of the headmistress while my parents went to Vellore. On their return, they could not stop talking about Dr. Scudder, the founder of Vellore and how well they had been looked after by the doctors and staff there. I made up my mind then that I wanted to be a doctor trained at Vellore. At the age of seventeen and a half, I went straight from Alwaye to Vellore where I spent the next forty-two and a half years of my life, until I retired at the age of sixty.

Q. What was Ittyerah sir like as a parent?

My father was a strict disciplinarian, who believed in the adage 'spare the rod and spoil the child'. I was very naughty as a child and was the leader of a gang of kids on the campus, so I had a fair share of disciplining! But I believe that it made me who I am today. It was understood that whatever I did, in no way was I to make him ashamed. My parents were very loving, but they made it clear that I would receive no special privileges. Though my college fees could have been paid by directly cutting it from my father's salary, my father wanted me to stand in line with the other students and pay the fees.

I studied at St. Mary's English School which was in the heart of the town and my day would begin by getting up early and walking three miles to get there. Fortunately, as I was good at studies, I won a government scholarship that covered the expenses of my school fees and textbooks. The pay in the College was quite meager in those days and my annual scholarship was more than my father's monthly earnings. We did not have luxuries but we did enjoy two annual holidays- once to our parent's native places in Kottayam and Mavelikkara and the other, a visit to my mother's brother in the Nilgiris for two or three weeks.

Q. In what ways have you maintained ties with the college after you left the campus?

I have visited the campus several times and the college invited me a few years ago to give a lecture.



I am embarking on this trip down memory lane of my U C C days with great joy. I was at U C College as a resident student from 1959–1963. I can't speak for all, but for me and for many others including four of my siblings, hearts and minds often yearn for those wonderful years at Union Christian College, Aluva. I know UCC will always remain in memory as 'A Shining City on a Hill'.

To write just about one memorable experience or incident wil not do justice to my four years of unforgettable and rewarding experience and life.

I remember the dedicated teachers who cared, friends who cared and shared and some friends who dared to test the limit of college and hostel rules.

Life was, in general, joyful with laughter and carefree days. Even the mundane happenings, ordinary days, and disappointments have become sweet or bittersweet in my memory. I remember a few tears, secret crushes, and a few broken hearts. There were occasional silly arguments and fights, but mostly the residential life in the idyllic setting of a bygone era was a happy one.

It is impossible to give a complete picture of my U C C experience as it has woven its way into all aspects of my life and the person I have become. After pre-university, I continued my studies for three more years as an undergraduate student majoring in Chemistry. Our professors were very inspiring and dedicated. Dr.A.M Chacko and Dr. M.V.Kurian were my wardens at Holland Hostel. I was fortunate to be a student of the renowned Mathematics teacher Prof. Venkataraman. Rev. C . John Bell taught us English. During my first two years, Prof . T. B. Thomas was our principal. He was followed by Dr. P.M. Mathai. They belonged to a select group of teachers whose knowledge, dedication, and noble ideals inspired thousands of students who studied there. Prof. Kuttipuzha, our Malayalam Professor was a living legend. There were many other eminent professors and lecturers during my time. Prof. C. T. Benjamin, Prof. O.M. Mathen, and Prof. A.K. Baby are just a few other names that come to mind. My nostalgic memories of U C C would be totally incomplete without mentioning the incomparable and larger-than-life personality of Andrews sir. He was our physical director. He knew every student and made it a point to know their families.

My memories go back to the football tour he organized during the Christmas vacation of 1960. We played against several teams, of which some of the notable ones were Madras Christian College, Loyola college and Vellore Christian Medical College.

We visited Prof. Venkataraman who was retired and was residing in Madras at that time. We were very happy to play against Vellore Medical College team which was captained by Dr. Jacob (Thampan) son of the Prof. K. Jacob. Thampan was a role model for the youngsters and was very popular.

The memorable days and events are many and varied. There were the college day celebrations, hostel days, social service league and planning forum celebrations, sports events, intercollegiate tournaments. SCM, SCF, and visits of prominent speakers and leaders. I believe today, as my beloved parents did then, that UCC is a special place with a unique vision. I am thankful and blessed to have been part of such a community then and now.

More than half a century has passed since I left U C College. I am in the USA with my family since 1971. I know those memorable days are gone and the times are different now. To look back for a while is to refresh your heart and mind so that we can look forward with hope and strength for the future. The memories of those times at UCC are safe with me and will never be forgotten.

BLESSINGS FROM MY ALMA MATER

The two letters – U C – bring to mind unending memories. Flame of the forest that flank the entrance, extends a red-carpet welcome in April–May. The winding paths leading to varied structures – old and new, some with arches and creaking wooden stairs, host different departments. The small courtyard in front of the office-room boasts of a mango tree planted decades ago by Gandhiji. In these tough times when all values seem to erode, its dwarfed branches and sparse leaves struggle, as though to uphold the principles of the Mahatma!

Our HOD, beloved Nambiar Sir who signed his name with a beautiful calligraphic flourish, would wave his hands leading many a Shakespearian character into our class – Falstaff, King Henry, Macbeth, Prospero and many more. Astounding clarity and measured precision in the use of a language from distant shores, and immense warmth and care in maintaining the rapport with his students even after they have bid adieu to the college.

In Valsala teacher – BV, as we affectionately called her, I evinced such passion for literature that she merged with her characters to present the very best. In such moments – the indecision in Hamlet, the tormenting doubt in Othello and the excruciating pain in Desdemona were all fully reflected on her face – an unforgettable image of a unique teacher, unknowingly moulding a teacher within me.

Phonemes, vowels, and diphthongs – the domain where Gabriel Sir (GDG) reigned supreme! I remember how at times the diphthongs or plosives, or fricatives would lead the otherwise silent class into peals of laughter.

On certain afternoons when even the leaves of the Mahogany trees stood still, casting shadows beside the chapel, we sat spellbound listening to Latha teacher's dreamy voice guiding us to Charles Lamb or to Chesterton's "Awful truths which brown paper art reveals.....that white is a colour.....and not a mere absence of colour.....virtue is not an absence of vices.....it is a vivid and separate thing like pain or a particular smell.....". Geevarghese Sir, so lively with his engaging smile, sparkling eyes and inseparable shoulder bag, dealt with the serious task of Literary Criticism. Sad to say, much of which has faded from my memory except his reference to Christ – that the miracle was not the multiplication of the loaves of bread and fish, but in bringing out the innate goodness of sharing in those who had gathered at Bethsida near Galilee.

How can one forget P J Joseph Sir who ushered in Lucifer, Beelzebub, and Satan into our classroom, when Paradise was lost to them. KR Joseph Sir's deep voice reciting lines from John Donne or Romeo and Juliet and his parting words at our farewell – "Dreams come true for those who wake up." The melodious voice of Marcus Chriselda Teacher transported us to the tragic world of Shelly's Cenci while Chacko Sir (PMC) often reminded us that 'marks make you remarkable'!

Once, while a serious lecture was going on, the doors of the gallery class were flung open and to our utter disbelief, we saw Birnam Woods enter our classroom; a group of boys skilfully concealed behind the large branches! The Professor was rendered speechless at this prank, while the students laughed in glee!

I yearn for those days when we could tip-toe into the vast library where infinite souls rest, their thoughts and ideas imprinted on yellowing pages, leather bound. I yearn for those innocent days when one could be mesmerized by the lines from the Eve of St. Agnes I yearn to believe – "Hope is the thing with feathers that perches in the soul and sings the tune...and never stops at all." But somewhere an invisible Raven says "Nevermore...nevermore!!"

Memories surge, sometimes they overlap. Some are sepia tinted; edges tattered like autumn leaves but still beloved. As I wind up, I fold my hands in gratitude for all the blessings received from my Alma Mater.

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





Thanksgiving service

Rev. K. C. Mathew, one of the distinguished alumni of our College and the Manager of the College for two terms, from 1993 to 2001, passed away on 23 July 2021. He was the Founder Principal of Bishop Moore College, Mavelikara. The Union Christian College along the Central Kerala Diocesan Youth with Movement of the Church of South India, played a crucial role in shaping his social convictions, educational goals, and the spirituality undergirding his role as a pastor.

He neither wore his Christianity on his sleeve nor did he make a show of his identity as a pastor. Rather, he let that define his role as an administrator who wielded authority with much humility and love. Irrespective of religious differences, he made it a point to visit the homes of faculty who either went through bereavement or had faced some other adversity and say a prayer of consolation.
