#### Department of English:

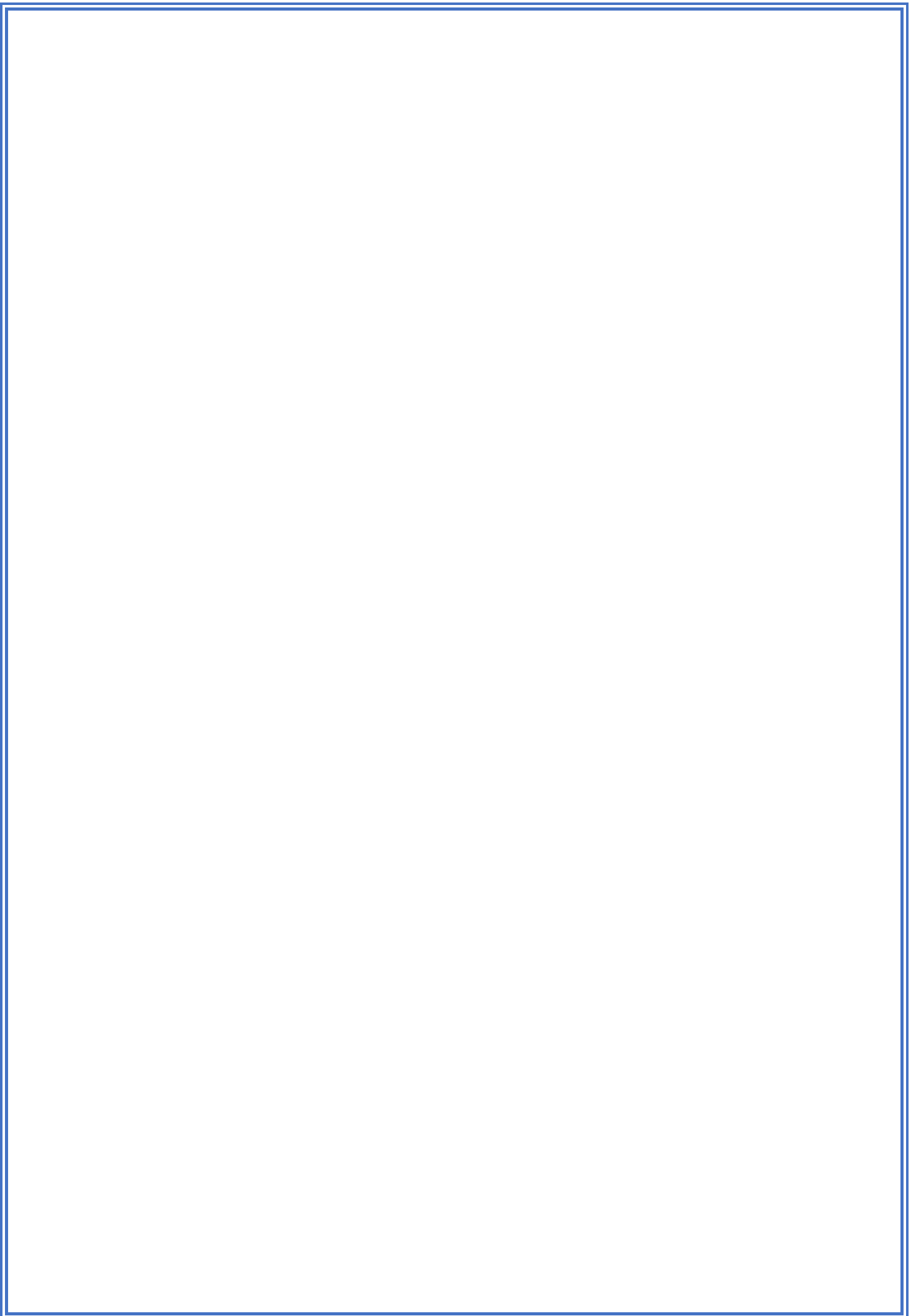



- To identify the weak students and give remedial classes and upload additional notes and videos to supplement the classes.



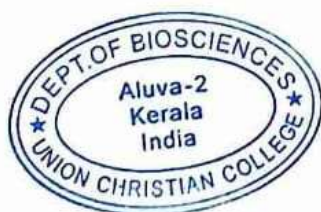
